Spring is springing in the <u>Watson Woods Riparian</u> <u>Preserve</u> and with that comes the birds and birding opportunities for all levels of birdwatchers. In 2004, Watson Woods was designated as an Important Bird Area (<u>IBA</u>) by National Audubon with a goal to protect and save critical habitat for birds and other wildlife.

Soon, we hope to see the familiar signs of nesting by a multitude bird species. In particular, we look for the return of the <u>Common Blackhawks</u> that have successfully brooded the last few years. Watson Woods provides our community with a unique opportunity to see wildlife as they are meant to be seen.


