Prescott Creeks is wrapping up work on our Green Infrastructure projects at Whipple Basin and the Adult Center of Prescott. With interpretive signs and benches up, people can take the time to enjoy these natural sanctuaries and learn how this type of landscaping not only can offer a bit of beauty to our homes and community, but also improves the quality of our watersheds. With the remarkable new growth this year, the project areas are functioning wonderfully: slowing runoff, filtering sediment and pollutants, and allowing water to percolate into the soil and groundwater. The project areas are also proving to be a boon to wildlife, offering critical habitat for a variety of pollinator insects, including those pictured here encountered after the early monsoon rains.
