The Road Ahead

Prescott Creeks is in the planning stages of the next phase of <u>Watson Woods restoration</u>. With remarkable success in our earlier channel reconstruction, planting, and habitat restoration, we have a solid base from which to build our next series of efforts.

As Watson Lake Reservoir continues to be threatened by a list of contaminants, the City of Prescott is proposing to undergo a period of study and monitoring in order to more effectively address the runoff and other sources of pollution. Prescott Creeks has proven to be a leader in developing practical strategies to mitigate the problem of runoff contaminants in the Granite Creek Watershed and beyond. Our work in the Watson Woods Preserve has gone, and will go, to help restore natural stream function to reduce contaminants from reaching Watson Lake Reservoir; all towards our mission to achieve healthy watersheds and clean waters in our region.
