

meltwater runoff. Our restored Watson Woods wetlands and riparian areas are filling and serving to filter what Granite Creek takes from the streets and culverts as the recent heavy, wet snows melt in the afternoon sun.



We are excited as we monitor the water quality in our local waterways, seeing the results of the efforts of the scores of volunteers who

contributed to our stream restoration and <u>urban natural</u> <u>landscape runoff management projects</u>. These projects work to slow runoff flow, <u>which can be excessive in these winter storms</u>, and remove sediment and other pollutants. Results from monitoring at our Whipple Basin and Adult Center projects done through our recent winter storms, in fact, show reduced levels of sediment, *E. coli* bacteria, and other contaminants as runoff flow passes through these sites, leading to less pollutants moving downstream and reaching Watson Lake Reservoir and beyond.
