This year's Granite Creek Cleanup drew some 575 participants and over 30 volunteers. While participation was up, the amount of trash and discarded materials collected was down, totalling just over one ton of waste and recyclables collected and processed. Perhaps this is a sign of success. Our efforts just might be having an impact in both the conditions along our creeks and public awareness of how valuable our waterways and natural areas are.

Managing Invasive Species: A Critical Component of Restoration

Spring also brings the seasonal emergence of many of <u>our invasive vegetation species</u>. While some of these non-native 'weeds' are not much of a threat, many are proving to be so prolific and aggressive that they take over and dramatically degrade local and regional ecosystems. Invasives can bring changes in soil chemistry, diminish biodiversity and species richness, and cause a loss of wildlife habitat.



Prescott Creeks works with a number of conservation organizations, land managers, and regional agencies to manage the spread of invasives as part of our watershed restoration efforts. Throughout the year, but particularly during the periods of rapid growth in spring and summer, our staff and volunteers are actively involved in cutting and pulling common teasel (pictured above), tamarisk (or salt cedar), Siberian elm, a number of invasive thistle species, and other problematic nonnative vegetation. Limiting the growth and spread of invasives gives native planting and seeding efforts, as well as natural vegetation processes, a chance to take hold and create healthy, functional ecosystems.
