
The first ice forms on the shallow wetland pools. Genuine cold fronts bring gray skies, flurries, and the first winter storms. Bundle up for a walk


open water. Hooded mergansers stopping by on their migration dive for minnows and snails.

Teaming Up for Wood Duck Recovery

Restored riparian areas of the Upper Granite Creek Watershed offer nesting habitat for many species of birds, among them the wood duck (Aix sponsa). After numbers fell through the 1900's,

wood duck populations are on the rise nationally as a result of habitat restoration, hunting regulation, and public



awareness. In

the arid Southwest, wood ducks rely on dwindling riparian areas, such as Watson Woods, for habitat and nesting.

Prescott Audubon Society and Prescott Creeks are collaborating to install nesting boxes to boost wood duck nesting success in local riparian areas. As snow flurries fell, we recently looked ahead to spring, surveying potential locations. The restored wetlands in the Watson Woods Preserve and less disturbed sites near Willow Lake will provide ideal habitat for wood duck broods to be reared on.

Get out this holiday season, and keep an eye out for an occasional wintering wood duck in wooded wetlands and ponds.


