Hello Friends,

Happy New Year from Prescott Creeks! We wish all of you the very best for the year ahead, and beyond.



The closing days of 2016 brought heavy snow to Central and Northern Arizona. Rain and moderate temperatures have our creeks running at steady flows with the sustained snow pack in the higher elevations from where our creeks are fed.

The National Weather Service announced that 2016 was the ninth wettest year on record for the Prescott area. Most of that precipitation, though, fell in the form of rain. While rain, often coming in sudden monsoon bursts, quickly runs off and moves downstream, groundwater



recharge and more consistent local stream flow is dependent on this kind of sustained snow pack providing meltwater through the spring.

The Prescott area historically has seen more regular and consistent snowfall, and snow pack, in the high country. Warmer, shorter winters and drought patterns over

much of the last 15 years have resulted in challenges in water resource management across the West. For those of us who enjoy watching a rippling Granite Creek while sitting in a downtown coffee shop, or taking a Thumb Butte walk accompanied by a gurgling Miller Creek, let's just enjoy winter, and wish for more snow!
