Hello Friend,



## **Urban Creek Walk**

Saturday, January 28, brought perfect Prescott winter weather for our Urban Creek Walk. Participants bundled up for the morning, and then shed a layer as the sun pushed temperatures into the 40's by the end of the tour.



Participants spent a leisurely morning looking for early spring growth on the native willows and invasive Siberian elm, and learning to tell the difference between them. Taking time beside an 1890's dam on Miller Creek, we found lessons in sedimentation and costs associated with water management still relevant today. Western bluebirds, hairy woodpeckers, and a host of other wintering birds kept us company while we stopped to notice ice and ripple formations on Granite Creek in the heart of downtown.
