
Hello Friend,

The storms we've experienced this winter have brought remarkable flows in Granite Creek. The sight of water overflowing its banks and braiding itself into the Watson Woods floodplain can seem intimidating. This flooding in places where it has historically occurred, like Watson Woods, however, is a critical part of restoring habitat and ecosystem functions to the watershed, and to our community.



Healthy floodplains, like that of the restored Watson Woods Riparian Preserve, are essential during periods of high flow. A creek or river dispersed over natural floodplain runs slower and with less force than when it is constricted into an unstable narrow channel, as we see in most developed areas. Slowing the creek allows for nutrients and sediment to settle before it reaches our lakes and reservoirs, where they only add to the pollutant levels in some of our impaired waterways.

Prescott Creeks continues to work to restore and protect our streams and wild places. Your donations and membership contributions are critical to ensure natural places like Watson Woods remain a vital part of our community.
