Hello Friend,

Even though it has seemed dry for some time now, the past weekend represented the end of the 2017 North American Monsoon Season. In spite of the recent lack of precipitation, Prescott was reported to have had the 3rd wettest in the past 10 years and the 7th wettest in the past 30 years. Cool nights, with smoke in the air are a sign that it is October. All of the creeks are changing into their fall costumes an offering a wonderful show for close observers.



Preserve Infrastructure

You might have noticed the construction at Hwy 89 and Prescott Lakes Parkway over the last several months. This project is the first phase of a much needed overhaul of Prescott's aging sewer system. During this project, the City has worked with Prescott Creeks to minimize disturbance within the Preserve. The originally planned open-trench across Granite Creek and its floodplain changed a Horizontal Directional Drill approach to bore under the creek which would avoid bulldozing mature cottonwood trees that were home to a family of nesting Black Hawks. It also prevented direct impact to the Granite Creek channel. As the project comes to a close in the Preserve, disturbed areas have been seeded and Prescott Creeks will plant slopes and other areas with volunteers to restore the area to preproject conditions.
