Biodiversity and Invasive Plants

Nature loves diversity. A walk through a healthy central Arizonan streamside corridor would reveal a rich forest composed of around a dozen species of trees, plus numerous shrubs and grasses. Each of these plants provides unique physical structure and resources to wildlife, allowing wild critters to specialize in their food sources and nesting behavior.

Prescott's riparian forests are dominated by Siberian elm, which is capable of rapid growth in the most marginal soils and can tolerate severe drought. Early each spring, before native trees are even flowering, mature Siberian elms drop thousands of half-inch round, winged seeds. This allows the Siberian elms to colonize disturbed riparian areas and grasslands. These disturbed areas are in the greatest need of robust, diverse habitat, but instead are converted into near-monocultures.



As a part of its mission, Prescott Creeks invests substantial effort into management of invasive plant species. Our regular <u>semi-monthly volunteer C.R.E.W. events</u> have most recently focused on removal of Siberian elm from Watson Woods Riparian Preserve, and we have seen compelling results without using herbicides.
