Hello Friend,

This first week of May it feels as if we're saying goodbye to winter and hello to Spring. Look around and you'll find many plants in bloom - like the native chokecherry pictured below. And the brids are going about their nest-building business for the year. Just yesterday I spent time observing an American Robin working on a nest near downtown in an alley that follows a highly urbanized unnamed wash. The change of seasons is always sure to impress in at least subtle ways if one takes the time to patiently observe it.



The spring storm earlier this week broke our dry streak ever so slightly. Rain gauge readings from around the area have been reported anywhere from .25" to .50" for the event. While this was a welcome and needed respite, conditions are still extremely dry in Central Arizona and beyond. In fact it is so dry that local officials advanced fire restrictions enacted only two weeks ago from Stage 1 to Stage 2 effective today, May 4th. More information about what this means and how to stay safe can be found on the Prescott Creeks wesbite. This is particularly important in places like Watson Woods Riparian Preserve where several wildfires have occurred-most notably the 1997 Watson Woods Fire.

2018 Cleanup - Wrap Up

On April 21st, 400 <u>community members gathered</u> at Granite Creek Park and Watson Woods Riparian Preserve to collect trash and debris and to repair trails. The result is **1.24 tons of trash** and approximately **20 tires** removed from the creeks, and **four sections of trail were improved**. The twelve year total is **47.3 tons** of trash and debris removed from the creeks. The estimated value of all this work from volunteers is almost **\$220,000**. That makes a big difference and none of it would be possible without dedicated volunteers and community spronsors. Thank you.
