The Watson Woods Riparian Preserve Restoration Project has officially broken ground. As Preserve Managers, Prescott Creeks has spent the last several years diligently researching, planning and securing over \$1 million worth of funding for the Watson Woods Restoration Project. The five-year project will address habitat and water quality issues along the lower portion of Granite Creek through habitat restoration. Activities involved will include relocating four reaches of the creek, creating a functional floodplain and six ephemeral wetlands, along with the planting of over 15,000 local riparian trees and several native grasses.

Saturday, April 18, 2009, Prescott Creeks will be hosting the 15th annual **Granite Creek Cleanup**. The event will be held at Granite Creek Park from 8 - 10:30 a.m. Immediately following the Granite Creek Cleanup Open Space Alliance will be hosting the Earth Day Celebration in Granite Creek Park from 10 am - 4 pm.

Each year community members and local organizations participate in the Granite Creek Cleanup by removing litter from Prescott's nine creeks. As many as 500 volunteers have collected several tons of debris and litter from these natural waterways.

Watson Woods : The project is not over yet!

Clip, count, move, dig, plant, and restore. This is only a handful of the activities Watson Woods Riparian Preserve has seen over the past 5 months. These activities have resulted in a more functional floodplain, the re-alignment of Granite Creek in five places, the harvesting and planting of over 13,000 trees, as well as, the planting of several acres with native grasses. All of this has been possible with the help of volunteers from our community and around the world who have contributed over 4,750 hours of volunteer service.

It is not over yet! While much has already been accomplished, Prescott Creeks staff and community volunteers will continue to work on the Watson Woods Restoration Project throughout most of this summer. Prescott Creeks is seeking volunteer to help with the planting of native grasses, invasive weed management, the installation of fabric to stabilize creek banks and to protect grass seeds, installation of drip irrigation to newly planted trees and a variety of other management tasks.

Watershed Improvement Planning

In an effort to gain a better understanding of the waterways in the Upper Granite Creek Watershed, Prescott Creeks has joined together with local, county, state and national entities to form the Upper Granite Creek Watershed Improvement Council (WIC).

With nearly \$300,000 in grant funding from the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, this group will develop a Watershed Improvement Plan. Planning is a new approach to protecting water quality that focuses on the whole area drained by Granite Creek.

Watson Woods Update

This last winter and spring volunteers planted nearly 13,000 cottonwood and willow trees in Watson Woods Riparian Preserve as part of the initial phase of restoration.

After a season of growing, a survey of the newly planted vegetation has been completed and approximately 95% of the trees have survived their first season. That's an amazing number for a riparian restoration project and it couldn't have been done without community support.

This winter volunteers will be needed to harvest and plant trees during the next phase of restoration at Watson Woods.

An interactive watershed model is being constructed by Prescott Creeks. The model will be a three-dimensional, hands-on, interactive representation of a watershed.
